- 4) Owned an average scoring margin of 7 > PPG
- 5) Faced a Top 75 schedule
- 6) Had a coach with 6 or more NCAA tourney appearances and at least one Elite 8 game
- 7) Either in NCAA tourney LY or
- 8) Have an All-American player

TOP 36 NCAA TOURNAMENT NET RANKINGS

The 2022-23 men's basketball season marks the fifth season of the NCAA Evaluation Tool (NET) rankings, which replaced the RPI prior to the 2018-19 season as the primary sorting tool for evaluating teams. An NCAA Evaluation Tool is used to increase accuracy and simplify it by reducing a five-component metric to just two. The remaining factors include the Team Value Index (TVI), which is a result-based feature that rewards teams for beating quality opponents, particularly away from home, as well as an adjusted net efficiency rating. The adjusted efficiency is a team's net efficiency, adjusted for strength of opponent and location (home/away/neutral) across all games played. Listed to the right are the NET Rankings of the Top 36 teams entering the NCAA Tournament.

[16] Texas A&M CC over [16] SE Missouri State by 1

The History Book notes that No. 16 seeded favorites of fewer than 4 points in the First Four games are 6-11 ATS all-time (2-0 ATS last year). That's not good news for either of these Tuesday night favorites. Corpus Christi played in a "First Four" game last season when they lost, 76-67, to Texas Southern. The Islanders were drilled at Arizona, 99-61, and at Oklahoma State, 81-58, this season, but won 12 of their final 13 games of the season to earn this bid. On the other side of the coin, SEMO finished in 5th place in the Ohio Valley Conference yet the Redhawks caught fire down the stretch to overcome a 9-game losing skid earlier in the campaign to capture this berth with an overtime win against Tennessee Tech, their first NCAA tourney since 2000. They did manage to score road wins over lined teams at Evansville and USF this season and have topped the 90-point scoring barrier on nine occasions this (89 points twice). While Tammy Christi plays solid defense (72.5 PPG), it may not be enough to hold the Redhawks at bay. We're not trying to rewrite history here, but this game looks like whomever scores last wins and advances.

[11] Pittsburgh over [11] Mississippi State by 6

An eye-opening sidebar note in "First Four" games: In only two years since the "First Four" debuted in 2011 has a team from this group failed to make the Round of 32 (2019 and 2022). But no "First Four" team has managed to match the success of VCU in 2011, and UCLA in 2021. The Rams knocked off 11-seed USC in the First Four, and then preceded to take down 6-seed Georgetown, 3-seed Purdue, 10-seed Florida State, and 1-seed Kansas to reach the Final Four, where they finally fell to 8-seed Butler. UCLA made a run from the First Four in the 2021 tourney to the Final Four before bowing out to top-seed Gonzaga, who then lost to Baylor in the title game. With that, we make the blue collar, deeply experienced Panthers the team to carry the torch in this event. For openers, Pitt brings a **10-0 SU and 8-2 ATS** ledger in March Madness opening games against #11 or worse seeds into this tourney. In addition, ACC teams in this 'play-in' event are 4-1 SUATS. On the flip side, the Bulldogs bring a 3-game losing skid in NCAA tourney games into this fray while standing just 3-10 SUATS against ACC opponents. Back the better team. Back the Panthers.

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 15

[16] Fairleigh Dickinson over [16] Texas Southern by 3

The strange thing here is that FDU is playing tonight despite the fact the Knights actually lost to league champion Merrimack in the Northeast Conference championship game. That's because Merrimack is a Division-1 newbie who made the jump from Division II to Division I in 2019, but is serving the last year of a four-year prohibition from NCAA tournament play following its transition. Editor's note: It's such an archaic rule that it needs to be abolished. Nevertheless, the Knights went 1-3 SUATS against 'lined' opponents this season (beat St. Joseph's), and are 1-4 SU and 3-2 ATS in this tourney, with their last appearance resulting in an 87-49 loss to top-seeded Gonzaga in 2019. On the other side of the court, 14-20 Texas Southern enters as the only team in this year's Dance with a losing record, yet own the Southwestern Athletic Conference tourney to make its second consecutive trip to this tournament (beat A&M CC in a "First Four" game last year before bowing out, 83-56, to Kansas thereafter). Being just the third team ever in this tourney with 20 losses, it's no surprise the paper Tigers are the only team in this event with a negative overall scoring margin. The Tigers did take down Arizona State, 67-66, as a 12-point home dog this season, and while they have the experience, FDU is playing with house-money. And we're not betting against the house.

[11] Arizona State over [11] Nevada by 8

Our Well Oiled Machine is first in line in this game as it notes that First Four matchups involving a pair of Division-1 teams finds that squads coming off an outright loss as a favorite are 5-13 SU and 7-11 ATS, including **1-9 SU and 2-8 ATS** against foes who were underdogs of 3 or more points in their last contest. That sets the table for the Sun Devils who were 17-6 SU against sub .690 opponents this season, as well as 9-2 SU and 7-4 ATS in games outside the Pac-12. And it certainly doesn't hurt knowing the pitchforks bring an **8-1-1 ATS** mark in this contest against Mountain West opposition. Meanwhile, the Wolf Pack closed the season on a 0-3 SUATS losing skein which is not a good omen for Nevada considering teams entering the Big Dance on a 0-3 SUATS losing skein are just 4-10 SU and 3-11 ATS since 2004, including **0-5 SUATS** as an underdog. We seal the deal noting that MWC teams are riding a **0-12 SU and 1-11 ATS** skein against Pac-12 foes in this show since 2001.

[12] Charleston over [5] San Diego State by 1

What better way to start Thursday's activities than a classic 12/5 seed matchup. For openers, a 5-seed has never won this tournament, while only three 5-seeds have reached the title game: Butler (2010), Indiana (2002), and Florida (2000), all of which lost to No. 1 seeds. The Well-Oiled machine (**WOM**) calls out the fact that 12-seeds have managed to win at least one opening round game against a 12-seed in all but two of 31 years dating back to 1991, while going 22-12-2 ATS overall since 2013. After a 17-15 debut last year, Charleston head coach Pat Kelsey has his Cougars running on all cylinders: with only two losses since November 11, Charleston is one of only four teams in the nation able to claim 30 wins this season. Considering the Cougars' only NCAA tournament win came way back in 1997, the odds seem stacked against a deep run here. But Charleston has been a tough out in this tournament, as all six games in school history have been decided by 10 or fewer points, despite the Cougars being a 12-seed or worse in four of those five appearances. There are also plenty of hurdles facing the Aztecs in this year's event. For openers, the Mountain West have never had a team advance beyond the Sweet 16, as opposed to 17 other conferences that have had teams reach the Elite Eight since the MWC was formed in 1999-2000. And it gets uglier as, per ESPN, the MWC is **1-8 SU and 0-8-1 ATS** in first round games since 2010. History has not been kind to the Aztecs either, as they've gone one-and-done in each of the last three Dances while dropping four straight games. They'd also better polish up their 3-point defense for this one – almost half of the Cougars' shot attempts are from beyond the arc. Add the fact that Charleston fans should descend en masse to the not-so-distant venue in Orlando, and we smell an upset right out of the box.

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[4] Virginia over [13] Furman by 3

Last year on these pages, we wrote: "After ruling college basketball for decades, the ACC is in a decline that shows no signs of slowing." So, what happened? Duke and North Carolina both made it to the Final Four. However, like Nostradamus, we were just a year early with our observation, considering the once-proud conference has been a total train wreck this season. Case in point: North Carolina failed to make this year's tournament after being ranked No. 1 in the pre-season polls, the first such occurrence in NCAA Men's Basketball history. And Virginia, the most consistent ACC team this campaign, could muster only a No. 4 seed on Selection Sunday. ESPN reports that at least one top-4 seed has lost in the first round in 13 of the past 14 tournaments (32 of 37 overall). Despite returning 5 starters from last year's 21-win squad, that's enough to keep Cavs head coach Tony Bennett up at night – especially since three of Virginia's past four tournament defeats have come against teams seeded at least nine spots worse than they were: 2021 first round vs. No. 13 Ohio, 2018 first round vs. No. 16 UMBC and 2016 Elite Eight vs. No. 10 Syracuse. Meanwhile, the Purple Paladins of Furman have averaged 23 wins over the last seven seasons and ride a 6-game win streak into its first appearance in The Dance since 1980. Furman is also one of four "double champions" (teams who won both their regular season and postseason conference titles) who are taking points from foes that won neither. We love fading these often-times disappointed favorites, especially with double-confident champions who are ecstatic to be dancing. Hey, the Paladins won their 15 conference games by an average margin of 16 points, and four players take the floor here averaging double-digits. Virginia can claim the second-best defense in the tourney, but they'll need to apply the screws if they don't wish to get screwed in this lid-lifter.

[4] Tennessee over [13] Louisiana by 7

The Vols looked like world-beaters this season until February rolled around. Tennessee then proceeded to play its way out of the Final Four conversation with an ugly 5-7 SU and 4-8 ATS slide. Don't look for a sudden return to prominence here: in seven previous trips as a top-4 seed in the modern era, the Vols have never advanced past the Sweet 16. This year, they have to overcome the loss of point guard Zakai Zeigler, (ACL) and complicating matters is the fact that only one of Rick Barnes' 25 career NCAA tournament victories has come against a higher-seeded team. And since Barnes' most recent Elite Eight trip 15 years ago with Texas, his teams have not beaten a single-digit seed (0-7) and have made the Sweet 16 just once in 10 appearances. Jeez, that's enough to keep Smokey on the porch back in Knoxville. UL Lafayette arrives today as reigning Sun Belt champions, and the Cajuns have an airfreight carrier in Jordan Brown, the former 5-star high school recruit who transferred in from Arizona. The all-Sun Belt first-teamer is averaging 19.4 PPG, 8.7 RPG and 1.2 BPG, and ULL has got added firepower in senior Greg Williams Jr., who has canned 40% from 3-point range this season. If you watched Tennessee demolish South Carolina by 40 points a few weeks ago, you may have your doubts about taking the Ragin' ones, but the **WOM** reminds us that Louisiana is **4-0 ATS** as a double-digit dog in this event. Even though the Vols are a banged-up bunch, they should get past the Cajuns today. Moving forward, however, is a story for another day.

3★ BEST BET

(12) Oral Roberts over (5) Duke by 6

We know it's considered questionable behavior to kick someone when they're down. However, with the ACC currently in a state of confusion entering this tournament, who are we to turn down a winning ticket? Especially when we get another chance to take points with a 12-seed against a 5-seed. Welcome to the first Big Dance in 40 years without Mike Krzyzewski or Roy Williams coaching on the sidelines. Duke's rookie head coach Jon Scheyer has admirably filled some mighty big shoes this season and his Blue Devils are riding a 9-game win streak entering this event, courtesy of solid play by 7-foot freshman center Kyle Filipowski, a 3rd-team All American who averaged 15.0 PPG and 9.2 RPG. ESPN notes that amazingly, the ACC has had at least one team reach the Sweet 16 in all 37 tournaments; however, it's our feeling it won't be the Dukies. This is the fourth time in school history that Duke isn't a top-4 seed, and in the two previous instances, it lost in the first round (2007 as a No. 6 vs. VCU, 1996 as a No. 8 vs. Eastern Michigan). It could happen again here against an Oral Roberts' squad that returned their top 6 scorers, and 7 of the top 8 from last year's 19-win unit this season. The Golden Eagles reached the Sweet 16 in 2021, and their current 18-game win streak is the longest in this tournament. Can't turn down another of the four 30-win teams in this tournament, especially when we get a look at **THE CLINCHER: ACC tourney champions are just 10-20-1 ATS in opening round games in the NCAA Tournament, including 0-7 ATS as a No. 3 or worse seed.**

[1] Alabama over [16] Texas A&M CC/SEMO by 21

Head coach Nate Oats and the Alabama basketball team did not take kindly to the recent negative press surrounding star player Brandon Miller and punished all three opponents in the SEC Tournament, dispatching Mississippi State by 23 and Missouri by 11 before lowering the boom on Texas A&M in the championship game, 82-63. Okay, that's out of the way, but the Crimson Tide ain't off the hook yet. Simply put, how is Miller still in uniform and playing? A first team All-American freshman forward, he was involved with ex-teammate Darius Miles in the murder case of a young woman in February, allegedly supplying Miles with the gun used in the killing. One can only imagine the machinations that have unfolded behind the scenes in order to keep Miller in the mix, and if Bama wins the whole thing, Oats has proven himself greasy enough to retire and run for governor. We're not sure which side of the fence you're on regarding this mess, but we will tell you that the overall No. 1 seed has climbed the ladder and cut down the nets in each of the last 5 tournaments. If Brandishing Brandon manages to stay on the court, remember the future NBA lotto pick averaged 19.6 ppg, 8.0 RPG, while nailing 40% of his 3-pointers. If, as we expect, the Islanders got here it was likely due to the grace of 5 veteran starters back from last year's 23-win squad, meaning they will not be intimidated by the presence of the No. 1 overall seed in this tournament. Then there's this hard-to-swallow pill: The Tide is 2-7 SU and 2-6-1 ATS in this tournament against foes coming off a win. With the glare of the spotlight only intensifying in the Miles-Miller murder investigation, we have no problem playing the fade game here.

[9] West Virginia over [8] Maryland by 10

So, the question begs: Is there any advantage in 8-9 seeds matchups in the opening round of this tournament? Not really. The closest the **WOM** was able to ascertain is that 8-seeds are on a 5-11 SUATS slide since 2018, including **2-10 SUATS** against 9-seeds coming off a SUATS loss. That's not good news for the Terps, who've won only a single game this month over bottom-feeding Minnesota in the Big Ten Tournament – and the Gophers are a big cut below what Maryland will see in West Virginia. Mountaineers head coach Bob Huggins was at his best this campaign, getting an invite to the dance after being picked to finish ninth in the Big 12 following last year's 16-17 losing effort. And while Huggy failed to make our Sweet 16 cut on this year's top NCAA tourney coaches list, the fact of the matter is his troops are 11-4 SU and 9-5-1 ATS in first round games when coming off a loss, including **9-1 SU** and **7-2-1 ATS** versus sub .740 opposition. Finally, ESPN shared this nugget: At-large teams that finished four games under .500 in conference play are 5-0 in the first round. Last year, 11th-seeded Iowa State became the first such team to reach the Sweet 16. This year West Virginia (7-11 in the Big 12) is the only at-large team in this year's field to finish four games under .500 in conference play. Take it away, Huggy Bear!

[1] Houston over [16] Northern Kentucky by 27

So, for the first time since 1983, Houston finds itself as a No. 1 seed in this tournament. Just how good was the team that ranked No. 1 more weeks than any in the polls this season? Power Forward Jarace Walker, a projected NBA Draft pick, is one of five starters to average double-digits this season. However, the loss of star guard Marcus Stasser (groin) in the AAC title game

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proved devastating to the scorching hot Cougars as they fell to Memphis. The second team All American averaged 17.8 ppg, 3.3 APG and landed 40% of his 3-point heaves. Two big questions, though. Can they compete with the best teams in the nation after playing in a league ranked ninth – below the West Coast – in KenPom's rankings, and will Sasser be fully healthy for this contest? We do know they led the country in scoring margin (+16.0) and they play a suffocating style of defense. They're also **6-0 ATS** in games when coming off a double-digit loss. The feeling here is coach Sampson and company will likely be hell-bent on making a statement in this game today. If it weren't for the Cougars' worst-in-class 1-6 ATS mark this season in games versus fellow NCAA Tournament teams, we'd consider snapping the rubber band. Nonetheless, the Norse closed like a racehorse, going 7-1 SUATS down the stretch to capture the Horizon League title. They returned 4 starters from last year's 20-win unit but were only 2-8 ATS in games outside the Horizon. They are 0-2 all-time in this event, as well as **1-24 ATS** in their last 25 outright losses. That might be all you need to know today.

[9] Auburn over [8] Iowa by 4

These two teams look appropriately seeded as each program suffered similar frustrations this season and failed to live up to expectations. On the heels of a 28-win effort the previous season, Auburn was ranked No. 15 in the AP preseason poll this campaign but underachieved as they suffered five losses by 3 or fewer points. Ditto for the Hawkeyes, a 26-win team last season that also underachieved this campaign, managing only 19 victories. As we called out in the Maryland-WVU game, 8-seeds are on a 5-11 SUATS slide since 2018, including **2-10 SUATS** against 9-seeds coming off a SUATS loss. The Hawkeyes check that box in this contest and take the court here with a -2.0 field goal percentage deficit, and a feeble 1.8 advantage in rebounding margin this year. Hey, the Tigers were a 20-win team entering the SEC tourney before being bounced in the opening round by Arkansas, so they'll be counting the minutes until tip-off. Auburn also owns the edge between head coaches when it comes to cashing tickets, as Bruce Pearl stands 8-1 ATS as a single-digit dog in this event (check the spread) while Iowa's Fran McCaffery is just 3-7 ATS in The Dance, including 1-5 ATS when not taking points. This beauty, compliments of ESPN, seals the deal: Auburn is 10-0 outright in first-round games.

[10] Penn State over [7] Texas A&M by 3

When Watty Piper penned 'The Little Engine That Could' back in 1930, he probably had no idea that his work would become synonymous with a refusal to accept defeat. Well, if ol' Watty had been around last week, he would have given his stamp of approval to the Penn State basketball team. The Nittany Lions played four games in the recent Big Ten Tournament and won the first three by a total of just 9 points before taking Purdue to the limit in a 65-67 loss. The proof is in the cashing, as Brent Musberger might say, and Penn State stated its case by going 4-0 ATS during the tourney. Now head coach

Micah Shrewsberry will try to keep the momentum going against what has to be a down-in-the-dumps bunch of Aggies, crushed by Alabama in the SEC title game. A plus for the Lions is their 10-5 SU and 14-0-1 ATS record in their last fifteen games on neutral courts. Sure, the Aggies may be 12-2 ATS as a favorite (9-0 ATS the last nine) since the calendar turned on January 1, but the Lions carry an 8-2 SU and 7-3 ATS ledger in their last ten games into this contest. They are also 13-5 ATS against .666 or greater opponents this season, including six ATS covers in a row when taking points. This will be Texas A&M's first trip to The Dance since 2018 but we don't look for the celebration to go much further. Both teams bring plenty to the table but being major dog lovers, we can't remain neutral here, not with the Nits on a 'neutral assault'. We think they can... we think they can...

UPSET TOURNAMENT GAME UPSET

[15] Colgate over [2] Texas by 2

Okay, who doesn't think of toothpaste when they hear the word 'Colgate'? Well, the fact is the university was named after William Colgate, who started the Colgate Company. He and his family were major financiers of the college for years and enabled the school to thrive. Do you know where Colgate University is located? The campus is in Hamilton, New York, which sits roughly halfway between Albany and Rochester – meaning weekend trips to 'The City' won't occur with much regularity. Right now, the toast of the town is Colgate basketball head coach Matt Langell, who is arguably the most under-the-radar coach in the nation. Not only is his starting five loaded with fifth-year seniors, the Raiders are also the best 3-point shooting team in the country, landing almost 41% of their tosses (they were #2 in the nation last season at over 40%, and #3 two seasons ago, also over 40%). Still, Texas is probably on a ton of brackets this week after embarrassing Kansas in the Big 12 Championship game, and Longhorn fans are looking at the possibility of having interim coach Rodney Terry win a national championship after leading this team up the ladder in the final game of this tournament after former head coach Chris Beard was canned on a sexual misconduct allegation. If Terry succeeds, he'll become only the second interim head coach to win a men's or women's national championship (Steve Fisher with Michigan men in 1989). Senior PG Marcus Carr averaged 16.2 PPG, 4.2 APG and hit on 37% of his 3-point attempts, all good enough to land him a spot on the third team All American list this season. The problem is Texas hasn't won a game after the first round in 15 years. That's certainly enough to keep an interim coach awake at night, that and the fact that Colgate is riding a 20-1 win skein entering this contest. The Longhorns' disastrous **3-9 SU and 1-11 ATS** mark in this tournament since 2010 makes it next to impossible to look their way, especially with added ammunition from **THE CLINCHER: Big 12 tournament champions coming off a SU underdog win are 3-4 SU and 2-5 ATS in the first round of the NCAA tourney, including 1-5 ATS versus sub .800 opponents.**

[1] Kansas over [16] Howard by 18

The Jayhawks are back to defend last year's championship trophy, but right now most of the attention is focused on the health of head coach Bill Self. The University of Kansas Health System announced Self, 60, had been discharged in "good condition" after arriving to the emergency department on the night of March 8 "complaining of chest tightness and balance concerns." The hospital also announced Self underwent a "chest procedure" to address the issue and is expected to make a full recovery. Translation: he'll be stalking the sidelines for as long as KU remains in this tournament. One reason Self's blood pressure shouldn't be a big concern today is the presence of 6-foot-8 freshman forward Jalen Wilson, who scored an All-American first ballot win after averaging 20.3 ppg and 8.4 RPG. Let's hope Wilson and his teammates feeling like defending the perimeter against Howard as the Bison are sharpshooters from beyond the arc, nailing 43% of their attempts. Former Duke star Kenny Blakeney has led the Bison to the party for the first time in 31 years, and they carry a 5-game win streak into this contest. While the Jayhawks are 13-0 SU and 11-2 ATS laying points when coming off a double-digit SUATS loss, and Bill Self is 21-2 SU and 15-8 ATS in opening round games, they are also a featured item in this week's **INCREDIBLE STAT** as outlined on page 2 – and that makes them a wobbly favorite here this afternoon in a game where they are certainly capable of playing down to the level of the Bison. Remember, they were a mere 3-12 ATS as favorites of 7 or more points this season. No thanks.

[8] Arkansas over [9] Illinois by 10

The Big Ten and the SEC lead the way with most teams in this tournament (8 each) and this is one of the reasons why. Yes, we understand the Illini are 8-1 ATS in games when both teams are coming off ATS losses, but they are also just 5-15 outright and 7-13 ATS against No. 8 or better seeds in this

tournament, including 1-9 outright in games in which Illinois sports a sub .777 win percentage. It's hard backing a team like this, especially a school that hasn't reached the Sweet 16 since 2005. As for the Razorbacks, they must overcome the recent ugliness of 8-seeds in opening round games being on a 5-11 SUATS losing run since 2018, including **2-10 SUATS** against 9-seeds coming off a SUATS loss. But it's our belief that if anyone can, the Musselman can. The head Hog just missed the cut list of our March Madness Top 16 coaches as he is 8-5 SU and 5-8 ATS overall, but he's gone a hog wild **5-1 SUATS** in this tourney against foes that are not arriving off consecutive SUATS wins. Don't forget, the Razorbacks were the No. 2 preseason pick in the SEC this season, so the talent is there. Not thrilled with the fact that both teams closed out 1-3 SU in their most recent four games, but we've got to pick a side, so we'll be makin' bacon with the better squad today. Woo Pig Sooley!

[7] Missouri over [10] Utah State by 6

The talking heads on Selection Sunday were gushing over Utah State, winners of 7 straight games before falling to San Diego State in the MWC Championship game, tagging the Aggies as a potential dark horse contender. However, since reaching the Elite Eight in 1970, the Aggies are 1-17 outright in the NCAA tournament (the one win came in overtime in 2001). Further, our feelings on such speculation can be summed up by the Missouri state slogan: Show Me. The key to Mizzou's success in head coach Dennis Gates' first season with the Tigers was convincing star forward Kobe Brown to not transfer out. The all-SEC first-teamer (15.9 PPG, 6.2 RPG, 46% from beyond the arc) helped the Tigers double up their wins from 12 last season to 24 this campaign. With decisions over Illinois, Kentucky, and Tennessee, they enter the NCAA tournament on a 4-game winning streak. A big concern for Utah State: Per ESPN – **Mountain West teams seeded 10th or worse are 1-23 all time, with 20 straight losses** since the only win in 2002. That's certainly not good news for the Aggies. Especially as they find themselves dressing up as a favorite against the 7th-seeded Tigers. Head coach Ryan Odom, who coached No. 16 seed UMBC to its magical upset over top-seeded Virginia in the 2018 NCAA Tournament, guided the Aggies to the NIT last year and the NCAA Tourney this season in his first two years with Utah State. They play a rugged brand of defense but it's going to take a major effort to move a mountain and overcome the MWC's putrid history in this tourney. Yes, Missouri will need to overcome a 0-6 SUATS mark in their last six games on the dance floor but they'll do so knowing they are 10-5 SUATS in this tournament in games in which they sport the better record. It's showtime for the Tigers.

[2] Arizona over [15] Princeton by 8

A battle royale between two members of the feline family? Most observers feel this will be little more than a sacrificial bloodletting by Arizona. The Wildcats followed up last season's 33-win effort under new head coach Tommy Lloyd with another staunch effort this campaign, winning the Pac-12 tournament and landing a No. 2 seed in this event. Leading the way was

junior Azuolas Tubelis, a 6-foot-11 power forward who averaged 19.9 PPG and 9.2 RPG. Zona is now 61-10 under Lloyd as his troops lost to Houston in the Sweet 16 in this tournament last season – his only postseason loss with the Wildcats (8-1). Lloyd's 22-2 SU and 17-7 ATS mark in games against foes coming off a win of more than 8 points also figures to serve them well here today. However, Pac-12 conference champions are only 2-6-1 ATS in the first round of the NCAA tournament when facing foes coming off a win. As for Princeton, the Ivy Leaguers sport a 10-5 ATS mark in this tourney since 2010, including **7-1 ATS** when coming off a win of 7-plus points. The Tigers are also 6-2 ATS as a double-digit dog under head coach Mitch Henderson versus winning opponents who are not undefeated, in addition to going 4-2 SU and 5-1 ATS as a dog this season. Remember, all four No. 2 seeds have reached the Sweet 16 just twice in the past 25 tournaments and given the Wildcats' wimpy **2-11-1 ATS** ledger in its last 14 dances, we'll be on the take today. Hold your nose and grab the points.

[7] Northwestern over [10] Boise State by 4

This game switched favorites with Boise State opening as chalk then flipping to the dog. Our best guess is the price wasn't right, not with the Broncos carrying a No. 10 seed in the contest. It also had a lot to do with the fact that Boise has NEVER won an NCAA tourney game, going 0-8 all-time, and has never beaten a Big Ten foe (0-7). Yep, there are a lot of ugly numbers out there and they all point to the Broncos. Winning the close games was instrumental in Northwestern reaching just its 2nd NCAA tournament in school history. Head coach Chris Collins was frustrated last season after going 16-17 while losing eight games by 6 or fewer points, but this season they won seven games by 6 or fewer points. In addition, the Wildcats were 10-4 ATS in games away from Evanston. We like these cats. Don't worry about Northwestern's one-and-done in the Big Ten tourney as Penn State darn near won the whole thing. The Cats will get back on track here.

[2] UCLA over [15] NC Asheville by 14

When he coined the phrase "March Madness" back in 1982 while doing a broadcast, little did venerable broadcaster Brent Musburger realize it would become the rallying cry for college basketball's biggest event. It's become almost as dominant a theme as UCLA was back in the 1960s and mid '70s of this event behind legendary John Wooden. Those days are in the rearview mirror for the Bruins, yet they remain a player in this event, returning for the 14th time in the past 18 tournaments. They've gone 28-13 outright in games over that span, including 10 straight wins over No. 12 or worse seeds while cashing tickets 7 times in those contests. This is the first time the Bruins are a top-2 seed since 2008, when they reached the Final Four as a No. 1 seed. They should continue the journey against NC Asheville, a relative unknown who may prove to be a stubborn opponent. After losing in the first round of the Big South tourney last year, the Bulldogs stormed from way back to beat Campbell en route to winning the title this season. Look, this team improved by 11 wins in head coach Mike Morrell's first season on the mountain before COVID stepped in the way and delayed their progress. Yes, the Bears are 6-1 ATS in this tourney as a favorite of 17-plus points, but the problem today is they lug along a 1-4 ATS mark as a favorite in The Dance when entering off a loss. Be careful here... the Bulldogs are a No. 15 seed with some bite.

(12) Drake over (5) Miami Florida by 10

This game has all the earmarks of being must-watch TV. It pairs two teams that each won a conference title – Miami, the ACC regular season and Drake, the Missouri Valley conference tournament. A trio of 5th-year senior guards leads the Bulldogs' attack: Tucker Devries, Roman Penn, and Garrett Sturtz returned with their extra year of eligibility after having led Drake to 95-wins the previous four years. The terrific threesome averaged 42.1 PPG, 16.5 RPG, and 8.3 APG. They match up well with a Miami unit that also emphasizes guard play. The Canes bring a wobbly **1-5 ATS** record as a favorite in this tournament into this fray as well as a 0-3 ATS mark in its last three Missouri Valley contests. Making matters worse, Miami mentor Jim Larranaga is just **1-5 ATS** as a single-digit favorite in this tournament. Meanwhile, Drake closed the season on a 13-1 winning run. In addition, they were 4-1 SUATS against .750 or greater opponents this campaign. However, we saved the best for last, compliments of **THE CLINCHER: Drake head coach Darian DeVries is 10-2 SUATS "between the 4's" in games on a neutral court.**

[4] Indiana over [13] Kent State by 10

It's safe to say these are not your Bobby Knight Hoosiers. They've advanced past the Sweet 16 just once since 1994. Yet they are **8-2 SUATS** when dancing off a loss, including **7-0 ATS** against greater than .666 opponents. They also own a few big notches in their belt, having swept both Purdue and Illinois while picking up a win at No. 3 seed Xavier. The **WOM** (Well-Oiled Machine) comes to their aid here as well, noting that No. 4 seeds are 50-8 SU in the opening round when coming off a SU favorite loss, including 19-6 ATS when favored by 8 or fewer points. Meanwhile, MAC teams are just 6-19 outright in the NCAA Tournament, and 0-3 SUATS as dogs of fewer than 6 points against the Big Ten in this event. In addition, the Flashes are frauds when taking on Big Ten foes, going just 4-14 SU and 5-13 ATS overall. Lay it if you play it.

[5] Saint Mary's over [12] VCU by 8

In days gone by the seeds of these two teams would have been reversed. However, we're not biting on this 12-seed. The Rams faced four fellow tournament teams this season (Arizona State, Kennesaw State, Memphis, and Pittsburgh), all in November, going 2-2 SU and 0-3-1 ATS in those contests. The 29 games that followed were all against non-tourney teams – making them as soft as a baby's bottom. That's not what they need taking on Saint Mary's, the top team in this tourney in scoring defense. In a testament to their sticky defense is the fact that other than the two

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losses they incurred against Gonzaga, the Gaels' other five losses were by 5 or fewer points. They are 11-2 SU and 12-1 ATS when coming off a loss, including **11-0 SUATS** against sub .800 opponents. Do you want any of that? We don't think so.

[4] UConn over [13] Iona by 6

This should be interesting. Future Hall of fame head coach Rick Pitino going up against what looks to be one of his soon-to-be conference rivals (Pitino is strongly mentioned in talks for the St. John's job next season). With it, slick Rick brings a sturdy 50-18 overall record in the Big Dance, including 16-4 outright in opening round games. He has led Iona to its second NCAA tournament appearance in three years. Thanks to MAAC Player of the Year Walter Clayton Jr. (16.9 PPG, 44% from beyond the arc) the Gaels enjoyed a 27-win season, including a 14-game winning streak entering the NCAA tournament. On the other side of the court, the Huskies are **11-0 SU** and **10-0-1 ATS** in their last eleven non-conference games. FYI: since 2002, when Ken Pom began tracking this stat, 19 of 20 national champions have finished in the top 25 in adjusted offensive and defensive efficiency. UConn in 2014 has been the only exception. Ironically, the Huskies that season were also the only team that broke through from the other side into the "Elite 8" rankings which itself has produced the national champion in 19 of the past 20 NCAA tournaments. This year's other qualifying team's entering the tournament on Ken Pom's list included Alabama, Houston, Texas, and UCLA in addition to the Huskies. Through it all, Iona is another "double champion" underdog taking points from a non-champion. Just do it!

[1] Purdue over [16] Texas So/FDU winner by 28

Folks, per ESPN, it's been a long time since a Big Ten (23 years) or Pac-12 school (26 years) cut down the nets in this tournament. In fact, last year, none of the nine Big Ten teams in the tournament advanced past the Sweet 16. As Ricky might tell Lucy, "you've got some 'splainin' to do." For the Boilermakers, it's the first time as a No. 1 seed since 1996. They'll enter the Big Dance this year seeking their first Final Four appearance since 1980. The Boilermakers have advanced past the Sweet 16 just once in six previous trips as a top-2 seed. They have, however, made the Sweet 16 or better in four of the past five tournaments, but have been eliminated by No. 15 and 13 seeds the past two years. The good news is they are **10-4 SU** and **11-3 ATS** in NCAA tourney openers under Matt Painter, which should comfortably get them underway against either of the two slop buckets advancing for the "First Four" round.

[9] Florida Atlantic over [8] Memphis by 3

If it's possible for a 30-win team to fly under the radar, the Owls are doing just that. So disrespected is FAU, they were actually a 2.5-point dog in the title game of the CUSA tourney when they rolled past UAB, 78-56. They

bring a glossy 7-3 SU and 9-1 ATS mark into this game when coming of a SU underdog win, including 5-0 SUATS the last five games. In addition, FAU is also **11-1 ATS** in games when both teams arrive off pointspread wins. Enter the American Athletic Conference tourney champion Tigers, off an upset win over a banged up Houston squad. They'll likely pay the price today, though, as the **WOM** notes that NCAA tourney first round chalk is just 12-25-1 ATS since 2000 when coming off a SU win as an underdog in a conference title game. And it doesn't help Elvis fans knowing Memphis is only 3-10 SU and 5-8 ATS against .828 or greater opponents in this tournament. With it, look for the Owls to fly to **5-0 ATS** in their last five meetings against AAC competition tonight.

[2] Marquette over [15] Vermont by 8

If you're planning on diving off the cliffs into the ocean before wagering on this game, you need to know that the last tourney win by Marquette was 10 years ago when it reached the Elite Eight as a No. 3 seed. The Golden Eagles are 0-3 since then, with all losses by 19 or more points. It's also been 10 years since Shaka Smart won an NCAA tournament game (with VCU). He has lost six straight first-round games (five by 4 or fewer points, including three in OT), all as a 10-seed or better, the longest such streak ever. Talk about fugly. You might want to take that jump after backing Marquette anytime soon in this event. Enter the Catamounts who were bounced in the first round of the tournament last season when they were edged, 75-71, by Arkansas. Despite a roster turnover – they returned only one starter from last year's unit – they came back to win the American East again. Head coach John Becker is an unsung winner and the Mounts are lucky to have him.

[10] USC over [7] Michigan State by 1

This has the look and feel of a Rose Bowl matchup on the hardwood. For starters, USC has carried on after losing the Mobley brothers to the NBA over the course of the past two seasons. Despite the gaping holes it caused, head coach Andy Enfield – remember him from Florida Gulf Coast glory – has held things together as this teams have gone 48-18 since the defections. Trojan backers also know they are **8-1 SU** and **9-0 ATS** in games when both USC and its opponent lock horns after each team was tripped up as a favorite in its previous game. In addition, the Pac-12 is on a **5-0 SUATS** run against Big Ten teams in this event. Despite beating some of the top squads in the country (Kentucky, Maryland, Indiana) and finishing the regular season with an 11-8 record in Big Ten play, this is not one of Tom Izzo's vintage teams. Still, it's March Madness and you simply cannot count the man out. Should they decide to devote their efforts to the mass shootings that occurred on campus last month, they could be a team no one will want to play. Izzo is 13-5 SU in this tourney when entering off a loss, so forewarned is forearmed. The bottom line, though, is the Trojans bring the better team and the better numbers into this fray. Play accordingly.

Greensboro Coliseum, Greensboro NC - TruTV / CBS
(Games at 3:10 PM, 12:40 PM, 7:10 PM, 9:40 PM)

[6] Iowa State over [11] Miss St/Pittsburgh winner by 6

The Cyclones have rewarded backers during the postseason like Bitcoin did before the s - - t hit the fan. For openers they are 29-11-1 ATS in their last 41 overall postseason performances, while going 8-2 SU and 7-2-1 ATS in this tournament when entering off a loss, including **5-0 SUATS** the last five. Second-year head coach T.J. Otzelberger is 24-4 SU and 17-11 ATS in non-conference clashes with the Clones, including 15-2 outright against foes with an inferior record. Only seven other 'lined' teams in the tourney own a better scoring defense. Whether it's the Bulldogs or the Panthers, ISU figures to be ready for the challenge, going 6-2 SUATS in their last eight ACC contests and 6-2 ATS in their last eight SEC skirmishes.

[3] Xavier over [14] Kennesaw St by 8

The upstart Owls rallied to beat Liberty, 67-66, to win their first NCAA tourney bid. Interestingly, the Flames had been 3-0 in previous ASUN title

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games. It was a remarkable turnaround for Kennesaw State under fourth-year coach Amir Abdur-Rahim. The Owls finished with a 1-28 record in 2019-20 – the first under Abdur-Rahim. They went 5-19 in his second season and 13-18 last year. Now the Owls will bring a school-record 26-8 mark to their first Big Dance. With it they are hooting and hollering in Kennesaw these days, as they are one of four “double champions” in this tournament taking on a non-champion in Xavier. The Musketeers have never reached the Final Four in 28 previous NCAA tournament appearances. In five prior trips as a top-4 seed, the Musketeers lost in the second round three times, Sweet 16 once and Elite Eight once. Sean Miller's teams at Arizona and Xavier have earned a No. 5 seed or better seven previous times. Six of those seven teams reached the Sweet 16, and four reached the Elite Eight. However, he is 0-4 in the Elite Eight and is still seeking his first Final Four appearance as a coach. They figure to get the win, while the Owls bag the cash.

[11] Providence over [6] Kentucky by 1

Certain games have the look and feel of “upset” written all over them, and this is one. The Wildcats enter fresh off an opening round loss to St. Peter's last season and are just two years removed from a 9-win season. Wooden Award winner Oscar Tshiebwe leads the nation in rebounding (13.1 RPG) while averaging 16.4 PPG. As talented as they are, or can be, the fact of the matter is Kentucky is 0-7 ATS in its last seven non-SEC battles. Providence bolted out of the gate at 14-3 before closing out 7-8. However, Ed Cooley's clan made it to the Sweet 16 last season as they cashed all three tickets in the tournament. Cooley is a long-term 104-74-4 ATS as a dog, including 19-7 ATS of late. You know the deal.

[3] Kansas State over [14] Montana State by 6

ESPN reports that no team has ever won a national championship after losing its first game in the conference tournament. Welcome to the club, Kansas State. Still, KSU was major overachiever this season after being picked to finish last in the preseason Big 12 poll. The Wildcats lost in the first round each of the past two times they were a top-4 seed – 2019 to No. 13 UC Irvine, and in 2013 to No. 13 La Salle. They boast victories over Kansas, Texas, and Baylor (twice). Florida transfer Keyontae Johnson (17.8 PPG, 7.7 RPG, 42% from 3-pointville) and Markquis Nowell (17.0 PPG, 7.7 APG), who were both named to the all-Big 12 first team, have been the anchors. Rest assured; they won't go down easy. On the other side of the court, ESPN reports Jubrile Belo (13.0 PPG, 6.1 RPG), last season's Big Sky Player of the Year, and RaeQuan Battle (17.4 PPG), an all-Big Sky first-teamer this season, lead a team that finished first in defensive efficiency in the league and also forced turnovers on one-fifth of its conference opponents' possessions. The feeling here is this game plays closer than a Brother.

(11) NC State over (6) Creighton by 6

There is a large contingent of Vegas wise guys who like this Creighton team, and it's understandable. After all, the Blue Jays were ranked No. 9 in the AP preseason poll after winning 23 games the previous season despite being beaten up with injuries. The truth of the matter is unless they win two games in this event and make it to the Sweet 16, they will fall short of last year's effort. That's the plight we see happening, and with it, we're not about to lay points with a team under this sort of scrutiny. For openers, Creighton enters with a crummy 7-13 SU and 5-14-1 ATS record in this tournament since the turn of the century, including **0-4 ATS** when coming off a loss as a favorite. On the flip side, NC State enters with a sparking **8-1 SU and 7-1 ATS** record this season in games when coming off a loss, including **7-0 ATS** the last seven games. In addition, the Pack is 4-1 SUATS in this tourney when entering off a loss when they sport a greater than .666 win percentage. We're backing the team playing the better ball with assistance from **THE CLINCHER: See Marc's AWESOME ANGLE OF THE WEEK on page 2.**

[3] Baylor over [11] UCSB by 6

Like Kansas State above, no team has ever won a national championship after losing its first game in the conference tournament. That's bad news for the Bears, whose season was laced with ups and downs. A 10-2 start was met with a 3-game losing skid. Then a 10-1 winning run was met with a pair of losses, only to close the season out with another pair of defeats. The question is can Scott Drew's capable band of Bears find another winning streak to close out the season? A cause for concern was that Baylor was outrebounded, 43-15, in its conference tourney loss to Iowa State. If that's not addressed they could be going into early hibernation. Yes, they're on a 7-1 SU and 6-2 ATS run in this tournament, but all of those games came as a No. 1 seed. On the other side of the coin, the Gauchos have turned into an ATM machine, cashing 19 of their final 27 games, while riding a **7-0 SU and 6-1 ATS** streak into this contest. While they've lost all four of their NCAA appearances, they managed to ring the register in those games, going 3-1 ATS. Cha-ching!

[6] TCU over [11] Arizona State/Nevada winner by 10

It's arguable and perhaps contrite, but the 21-win Horned Frogs may have taken a leap backward this season following last year's 21-win effort. That's because TCU, with all five starters back, was ranked No. 14 in the AP preseason poll, yet finds itself ranked outside the Top 20 entering this year's tournament. A lot had to do with losing Mike Miles Jr. for 5 games with a knee injury, games in which the Frogs logged a 1-4 SUATS record. He returned for the final five games of the regular season, and with it, TCU seems to have found a bit of its rhythm while going 4-3 since. It doesn't help that the Frogs are one of the worst three-point shooting teams in the nation. They were 7-4 SU and 8-3 ATS in games off a loss this season, including **5-0 ATS** as a favorite. With head coach Jamie Dixon standing 9-4 outright in Round One of this tourney, we have no problem laying the small wood with the leap froggers.

[3] Gonzaga over [14] Grand Canyon by 12

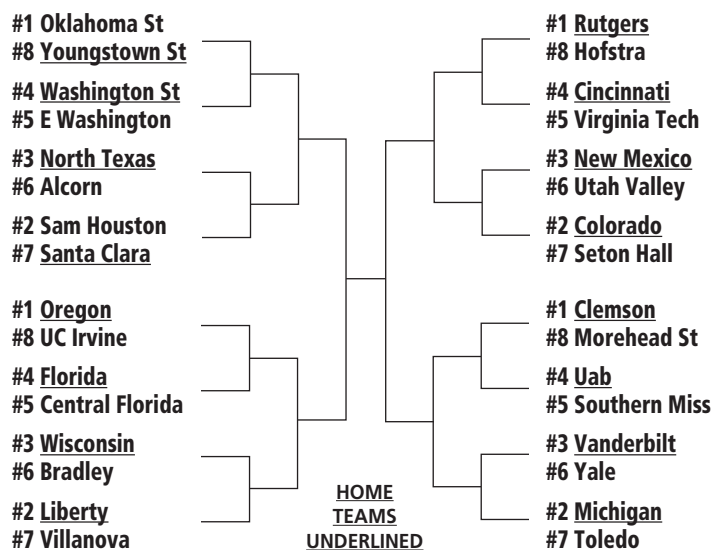
The Lopes arrived here in a circuitous way. The Western Athletic Conference awarded seeds in its conference tourney differently, not based entirely on conference records. They used an analytical approach and rewarded teams for their non-conference schedules and results. The goal was to reward teams for scheduling better opponents (read: winning) and dinged those for scheduling worse opponents (read: losing). Ken Pom, widely recognized as college basketball's most respected advanced metrics analyst, concocted the formula. Utah Valley (24-7, 15-3 WAC) finished atop the league standings and Sam Houston (24-6, 14-4) finished second. Yet Sam Houston earned the No. 1 seed. By giving the No. 1 seed to the team it believes has the best NCAA résumé, the WAC increases the chances of that team making the NCAA field, earning a higher seed than any other WAC team, and ultimately winning a game (or games). It didn't work, though, when Grand Canyon, the tournament's No. 5 seed, drilled a 3-pointer with 51 seconds remaining to lift them past top-seeded Sam Houston 78-75 in the semifinals of the Western Athletic Conference Tournament. The Antelopes then rolled past Southern Utah to gain this nod. They lost in their first and only NCAA tourney appearance in 2021 as a No. 15 seed to Iowa, 86-74. So, while it's back to the drawing board for the WAC in this year's event, it looks like another one-and done taking on a Gonzaga group that has won 13 straight first round games by an average 17 PPG. That won't cut the ATS mustard today, though. With the Zags sporting a **0-5 ATS** skein in their last five games in this tourney, we can only take it if we play it.
